Welcome to my workshop! I will begin by saying, "I am not a teacher - I am an awakener." I share these tips, tools, techniques, ideas and inspirations to help awaken players to wonderful possibilities!

Workshop notes include outline, examples and sheet music pdf (Amazing Grace, key of G). This workshop pairs nicely with Denise's LH, Leader of the Band workshop. Note: Song titles in orange indicate music in my Harp Gathering concert.

- Many ways to glissando - GLISS WITH GLEE!

- What can I say...they sound cool!
- Create atmosphere
- Gets us from here to there hi to low, etc.
- Fill time, space Leverage*
- Give time for lever changes
- Dramatic or atmospheric way to end piece Chipmunk Scoot*

~ Lone melody line - Be BOLD! don't be afraid of SPACE!

~ Parallel single note lines - 3rds, 4ths, 5ths, octaves apart etc. The Smile in Your Eyes*

~ Ornamentation and Fills- grace notes, turns, "trip up," trip down," fills - fill in those nooks and crannies with notes, runs, patterns, etc. Here, there and everywhere throughout my music*

~ Trill - 1 or 2 fingers - Intro of Leverage*

 \sim **Contrary motion** take your melodic or bass lines in different directions - one going up and the other goes down.

~ Chords - partials (3rds, open 5ths, etc), inversions (see handout)

~ Drumming on sound board Sing Along*

~ Change time signature; feel, flavor

~ **Rhythmic chords** - see notated pattern in handout. **The Smile in Your Eyes*** uses it; sheet music available for purchase at <u>https://marthagallagher.bandcamp.com</u>

 \sim **Damping** - what it is, does, why, how to - **Leverage***

~ **Delicious Blue Notes** (In the key of G, try sliding from an B natural (lever up) to an Bb, letting the slide sound. **Chipmunk Scoot***

I play Amazing Grace through several times at end of workshop video. I invite you to play along, experimenting using the possibilities we explore in this workshop.

Chord Inversion Basics



Rhythmic Pattern #1



This pattern can be played letting the strings ring or you can damp the notes immediately after playing them, using your palm or just fingers. Keep hands relaxed when doing this, so there is structure but not stressful rigidity. Damping the notes gives the pattern a much more staccato punch, making it sound kinda funky, jazzy.

You don't have to use the pattern throughout an entire song. Play four bars as the intro to your piece, then play the song as usual, filling in between verses with this pattern. This way the pattern is implied even when you're not actually playing it. This sometimes makes it easier to play the song, plus the pattern is not being used ad nauseum, which can negate it's effectiveness.

Play around with other time signatures, accents, etc. and discover your own patterns - have fun!!
